SCRAP THE HOUSEHOLD WASTE SITE CHARGE

We are concerned about the hugely unpopular charges for inert waste introduced by the Council in February. We think this will lead to more fly tipping and we have already received many reports of fly tipped materials in our roadsides and off road areas. These charges should be immediately reversed. We want to ensure that residents can access a service that meets their needs.



GET TOUGH ON PLANNING BREACHES

We want the Council to get tough on developers who breach planning conditions, putting extra money into the budget for Planning Enforcement prosecutions. The service takes too long to investigate breaches of planning permissions. Residents complaints need to be dealt with much more quickly to minimise frustrations of local residents. We need to restore confidence in the service.



COMMUNITY COMMITTEE FUNDING

The Outer North West Community Committee Wellbeing Fund has money available in grant form which local organisations can access. We have been able to fund a number of local projects with this money - Defibrillators across the Ward, upgrades to local facilities such as Pool Football Club, Robert Craven Hall, Adel War Memorial Hall, Cookridge Village Hall and OPAL.



PROTECTING THE VULNERABLE

We will reverse the cuts to our most vulnerable learners putting money into schools to support children with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities. We will protect our most vulnerable older people by removing the charges for the Sheltered Warden Service. We will improve access to toilets for disabled people by investing £250k to convert existing facilities and create new ones.

A CULTURAL LEGACY FOR LEEDS

We will use the power of local business to deliver an EXTRA £1m towards a cultural legacy in Leeds. We want to give everyone the opportunity to experience local theatre, drama, dance, art and historic culture. Leeds has a large number of cultural attractions and we want to ensure that these continue to bring business into Leeds. Locally, we have been able to help fund many projects.



MAINTAINING OUR NEGLECTED ROADS

We will invest an extra £1.5m on maintaining our roads network which is in a very poor condition. More money needs to be spent on patching the roads, not just filling in potholes with tarmac only to have them pop out again within days. Full scale maintenance needs to be carried out on a number of roads in the Ward. Pavements also need attention.



KEEPING COMMUNITIES LITTER FREE AND CLEAN

Fly Tipping and litter is a blight on many areas and we will invest £100,000 city wide to deal with this. It is not acceptable that people are allowed to litter our beautiful area without being brought to account. We need to get more enforcement action taken so that people think twice before they drop a piece of litter, and that proper penalties are in place for environmental damage.



ROAD SAFETY MEASURES

We must take the most appropriate measures to ensure the safety of pedestrians, motorists and cyclists. Any traffic calming measures introduced must be fully consulted upon and residents must be listened to. We have funded 6 Speed Indicator Devices. However, the Council should be funding these, not Ward Councillors or Parish Councils.
